

PRIANCA, NATHALIA, & KARISHMA PARVEZ

FOR THE PARVEZ SISTERS, work in the medical field is a family affair. They grew up visiting the hospital in Bangladesh where their father and mother worked as a doctor and a nurse. Years later, each of the Parvez sisters are launching nursing careers of their own, leveraging New Futures scholarships to start their studies at Montgomery College.

Karishma, approaching her final semester at MC, is also a recipient of a Board of Trustees scholarship, which covers her tuition. But for Karishma and so many young adults, tuition is only one piece of the higher education puzzle. The flexibility of her New Futures scholarship has covered the costs of transportation, books, exams, fees, and other costs beyond tuition, so she can focus on her coursework instead of its financial toll.

And the Parvez sisters all agree that the emotional support they receive from their Advisor, Ms. Silvana, and the rest of the New Futures Family is even more critical than their financial awards.

Prianca remembers her first New Futures workshop:

"We met other Scholars and discovered that a lot of us are first generation immigrants and college students in the US. In high school, most classmates weren't having the same experience as my sisters and me. But with New Futures, we got to form bonds with others just like us. And now as a Second-Time Scholar pursuing my bachelor's, I can talk to other students who are going through the same thing I did, and I can support them like those who helped me."

Nathalia reflects on the career connections she has made through New Futures:

"Last year, I attended New Futures' site visit with MedStar Washington Hospital. I got to shadow a nurse in the trauma unit and could learn what the job was really like."

And Prianca, who may want to become a travel nurse someday, has connected with a travel occupational therapist through New Futures.

We know that Prianca, Nathalia, and Karishma have bright futures ahead of them. And we know that New Futures' deliberate combination of flexible scholarships, heart-led academic advising, and innovative career networking opportunities removes barriers, opens doors, and instills confidence as they forge their paths.

Many experienced sudden lay-offs and devastating financial disruptions. Most had to navigate challenging transitions to distance learning in their community college coursework. All face uncertainty in a rapidly changing work environment. New Futures stands with our Scholars as we approach these questions together.

Advisors pivoted seamlessly to FaceTime, Zoom, and phone appointments for our personalized academic and career advising, supporting Scholars through a host of questions and challenges.



We are innovating the way we connect Scholars and Alumni with career connections and networks, relying less on workshops and networking opportunities and more on the strength of our relationships with industry partners, regional employers, and professionals in the fields.



New Futures established and funded a \$150,000 **Scholar Emergency Fund** to help Scholars cover basic needs like rent, utilities, medical bills, and other expenses. By ensuring Scholars can meet their emerging short-term needs, we help the mitigate the long-term ramifications on their educational pursuits, career plans, and lifelong financial security.
