2017 New Futures Award Honoree

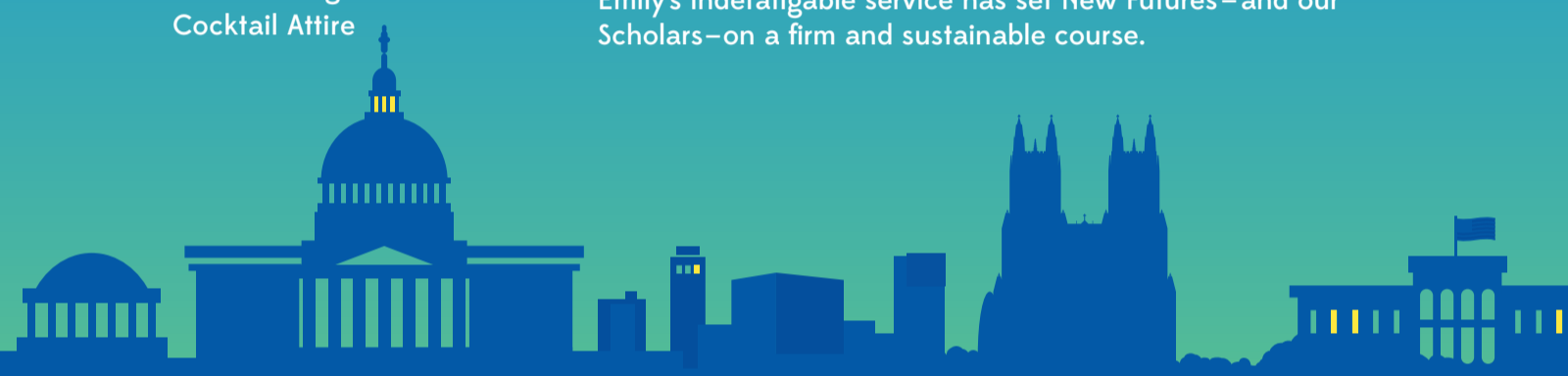
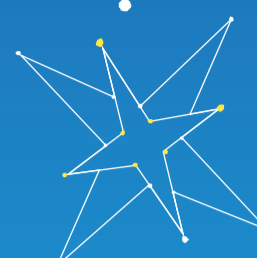
